

# Summative # 1 --Note Card Assessment for Dog Gone Pawer-ful Writing with PowerPoint

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## **Note Cards**

### **Summative Assessment**

Constructed Response/Day 7

\*This activity involves student production of at least 3 note cards on assigned content. Cards are periodically checked formatively and summatively assessed.

**Standards Assessed:** L.A.A.2.3.7.6.1 (Students are not using a variety of techniques. Just one.), L.A.A.2.3.6.6.2, L.A.B.2.3.1.6.1 (Students are only writing notes and outlining)

**Duration:** 5 minutes per set of cards

#### **Teacher Directions:**

##### Prior To Day 4:

Scan student note cards for criteria and provide feedback as needed.

##### On Day 4:

Collect note cards and formatively assess student work. Give feedback that will enable students to self-correct their work.

##### On Day 5:

Return note cards with comments and give students additional opportunities to correct/complete.

##### On Day 7:

Collect note cards and summatively evaluate according to criteria.

#### **Student Directions:**

##### On Days 1-3:

Complete the note cards according to criteria discussed in class:

- Minimum of three cards covering at least three subtopics.
- Each note card has at least two informative comments/statements about subtopic.
- Source information is noted including URL if an Internet source.

##### On day 4:

Turn in your note cards to your teacher so she can formatively assess your work.

##### On Day 5:

Receive your note cards back and make corrections according to your teacher's feedback.

##### On Day 7:

Be prepared to turn in your note cards so your teacher can summatively assess your work.

**Scoring Method and Criteria:** Note cards should contain a heading that reflects one of the subtopics generated from Day 1 activities. Note cards should also contain at least two relevant notations pertaining to the subtopic. Additionally, students will note the source information including card catalog number, URL, etc. to show evidence they were able to locate the information and they obtained material from at least two sources.
