Oral Presentation Rubric
Summative Assessment

*This rubric measures student ability to present the Power Point information while using the PowerPoint presentation as a visual aid.

Duration: 5 minutes per presentation

Teacher Directions:

Prior To Day 8:

1. Duplicate a copy of the assessment so that every student in the class has a copy.
2. Go over the rubric with students making sure they understand it.
3. Make sure students understand the speech process and items they will be responsible for.
4. Review daily to ensure student retention of information.

Beginning On Day 9:

1. On the student's assigned presentation date, make sure the rubric is available to score as the student is presenting. This saves time and allows for a truer assessment.
2. Assess student's presentations using the rubric. Additional notes or feedback can be indicated on the rubric as well. This may help if additional reflection is needed after the student presents.
3. Give feedback to students promptly.

Student Directions:

Prior to Day 8:

1. Read the rubric as your teacher goes over it.
2. Make sure you understand what is expected of you during the presentation.
3. Study the rubric periodically to make sure you are achieving mastery.
4. Practice at home for your presentation and be prepared with your disk uploaded to the presentation station and rubric on your assigned date. It may be helpful to have your parents listen to your presentation and score you on the rubric so you know where you are.
5. Review the rubric and practice each component during class activities.
6. Seek feedback from your classmates/group during Day 8 to help improve your presentation style.

On Day 8:

1. Make sure you have your disk and rubric on your assigned date.
2. Make sure you have practiced your presentation.
3. Be ready when your teacher calls your name to give your presentation.

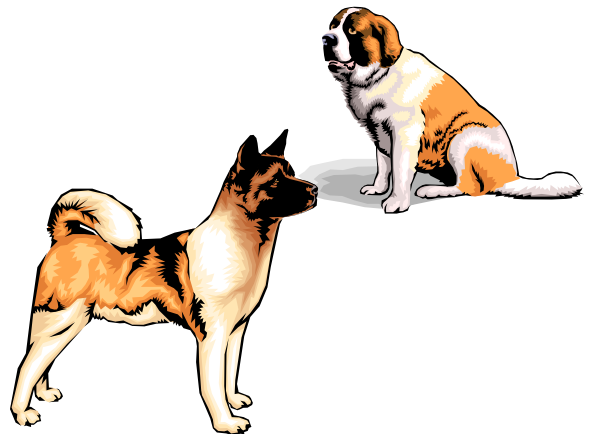

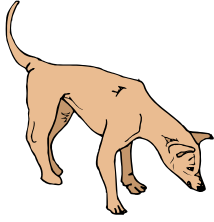
