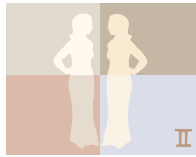

Conflict and Resolution



Conflict: A problem or struggle between two opposing forces in a story.

Person against person: One character has a problem with another character or characters.

Person against self: A character struggles with him- or herself.

Person against society: A character has a problem with society, the school, the law, or a tradition.

Person Against Nature: A character struggles against an element of nature: a blizzard, a hurricane, etc.

Person against Fate (God): A character struggles with a problem that seems beyond his or her control.
