

Sample Format for Data Tables, Bar Graphs, and Double Bar Graphs

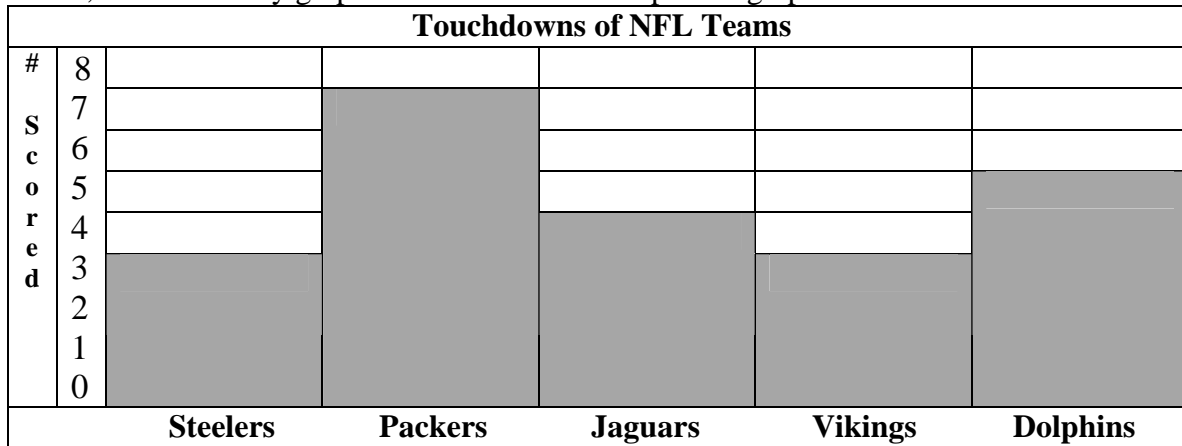
DATA TABLES

Our data tables contain two columns. Under one column, students list the NFL Teams. The other column contains the number of touchdowns, penalties, field goals, or fumbles produced by the team. For example, a data table for the first set of information might look like this:

<u>NFL Team</u>	<u>Number of Touchdowns Scored</u>
Steelers	3
Packers	7
Jaguars	4
Vikings	3
Dolphins	5

BAR GRAPHS

Each bar graph contains a title, labels for the horizontal and vertical axes, an appropriate scale, and accurately graphed data. Here's a sample bar graph for the above data:



DOUBLE BAR GRAPHS

Double bar graphs contain the same elements of single bar graphs, however the title, labels, and bars reflect both sets of data being graphed. When graphing, students list bars side by side for each set of data. For example, a section of a double bar graph representing the Steelers' and Packers' statistics might look like this:
