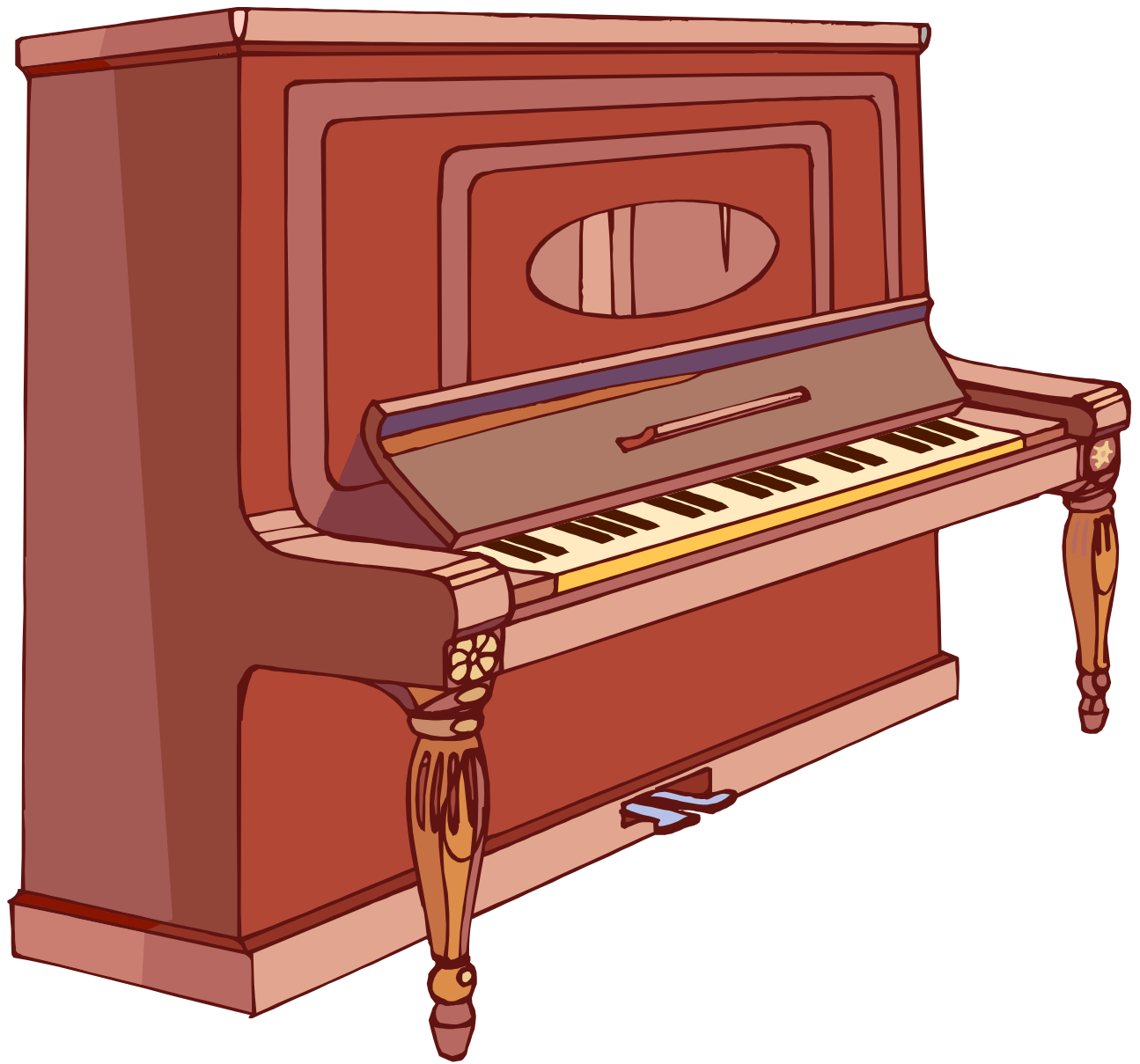

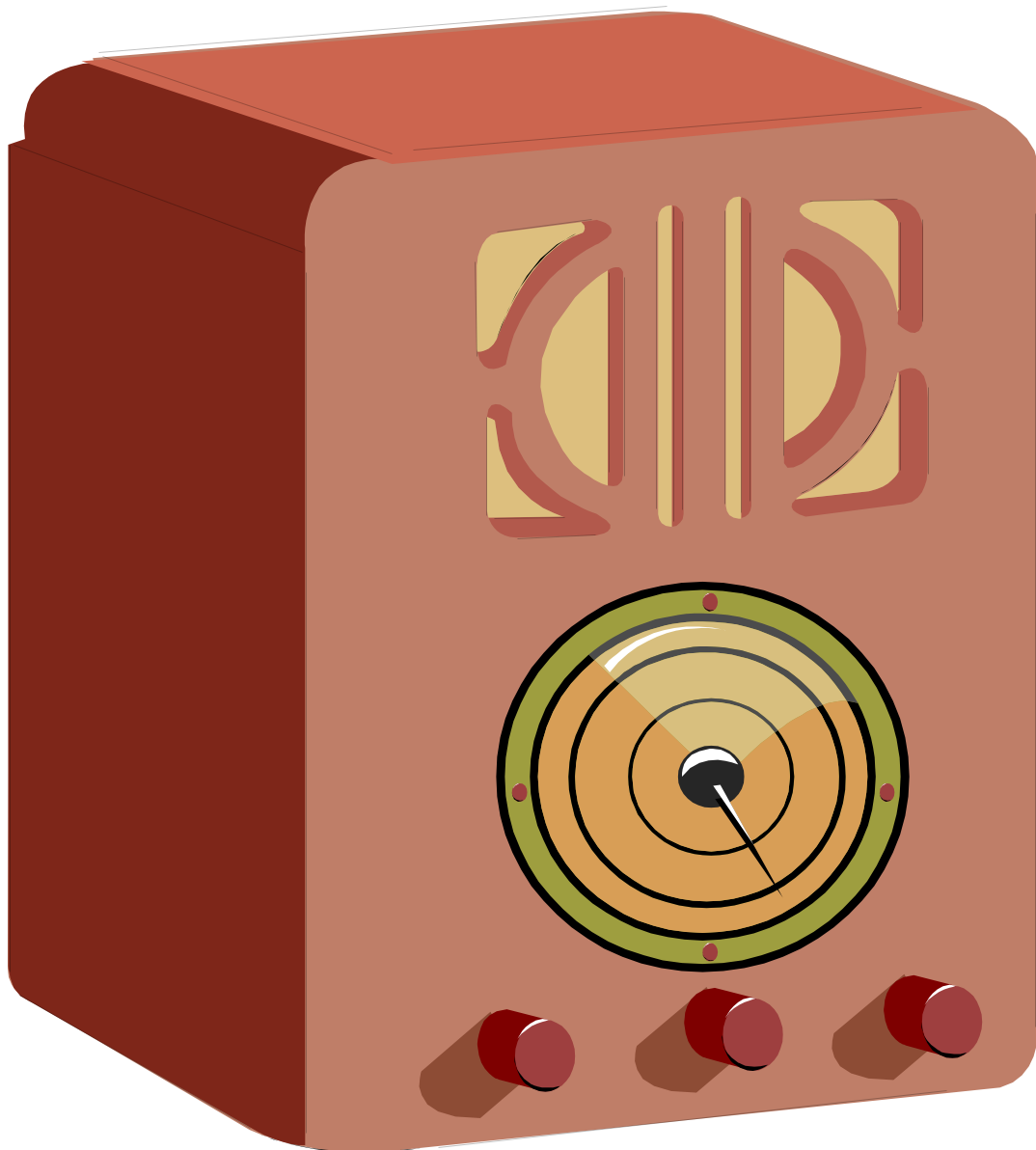

- Canned milk

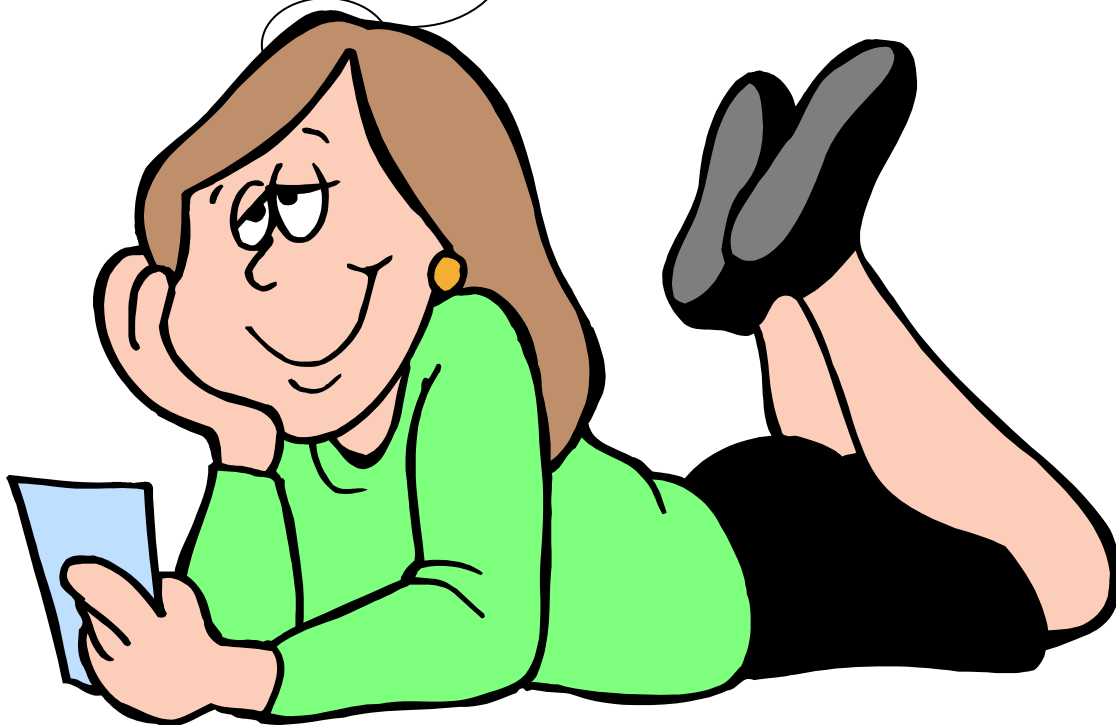

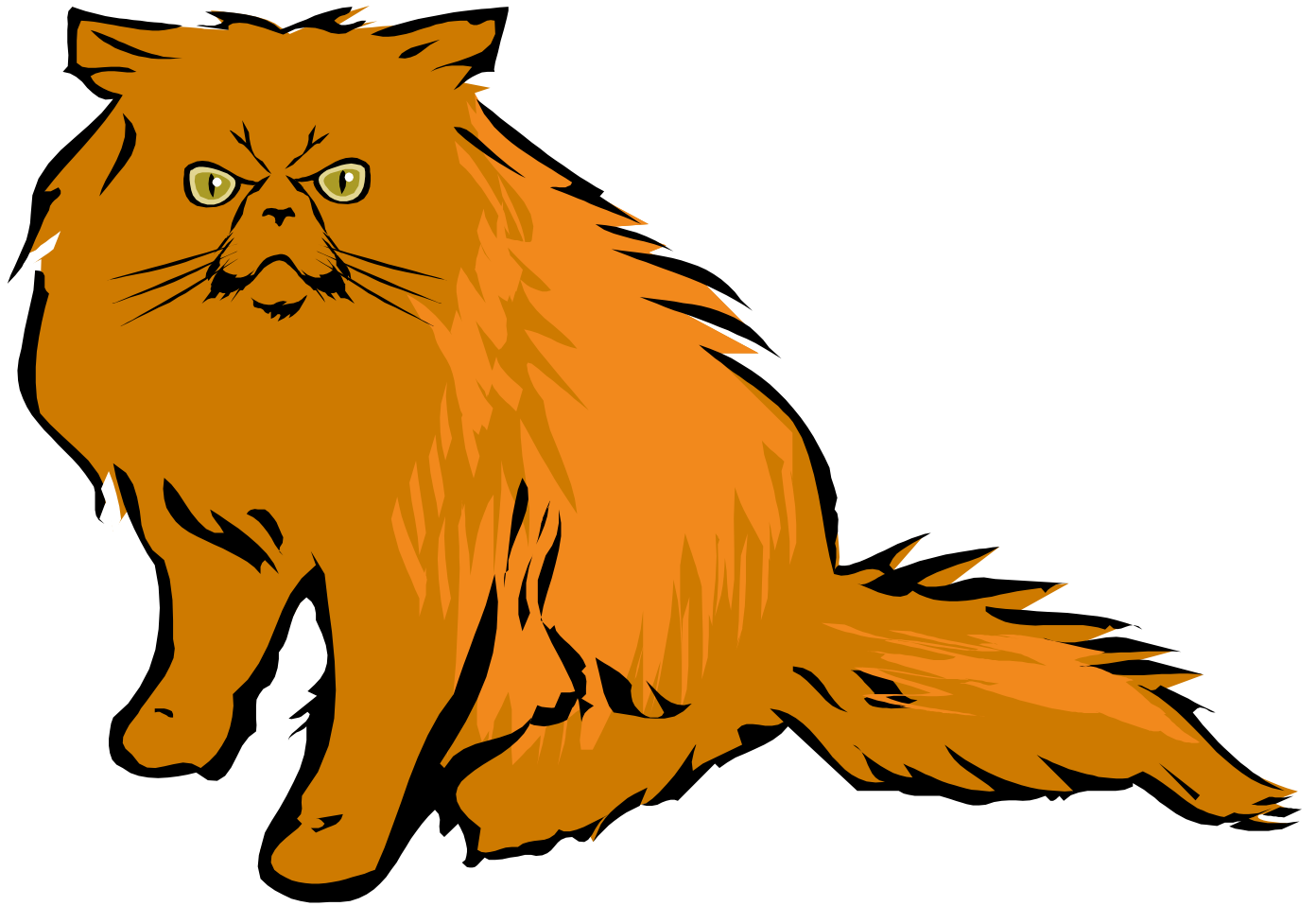
