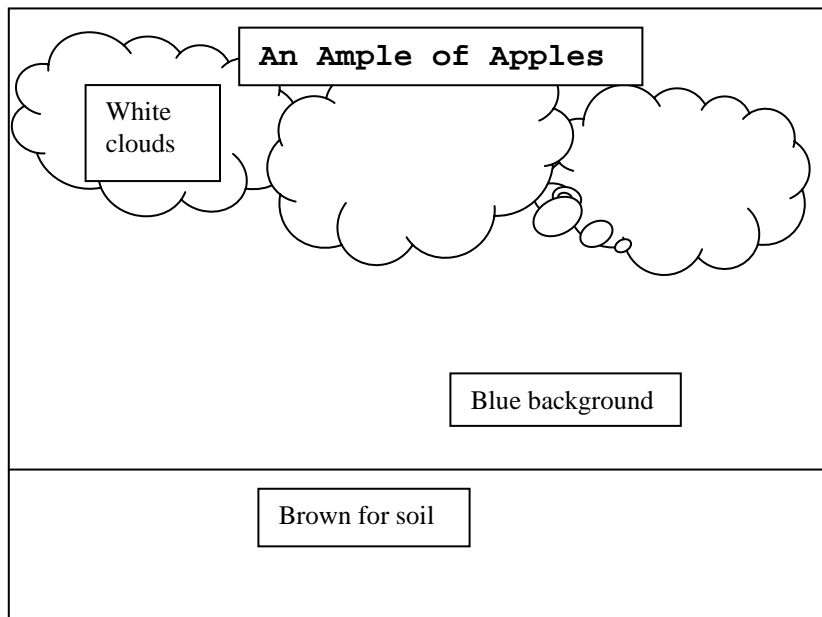


Display Board Directions

I use a bulletin board and cover it with bulletin board paper to look like an outdoor scene with a blue or white background, brown for the soil at the bottom, and clouds stapled to the top for the sky. I use a marker to draw a big “u” in the soil for the hole and tape the seeds inside the hole with clear mailing tape. (Use a transparent tape so students will be able to see the seeds.) I also draw the roots. However, if you wish to cut them out, you could. Then I just change my picture by stapling the objects on the board. It’s very easy and the children really do watch to see what’s happening with this board. No bulletin board??? Just draw the picture on chart paper and hang from your chart stand or use poster board to make the background and set it on your easel. Your background display should look something like this.
